OUTRIGGER FIJI BEACH RESORT, FIJI

Fiji is arguably the most family-friendly island in the world – not to mention only a mere few hours' flight from



CLUB MED, BALI

As many Aussies already know well, Bali is a great destination for family holidays. And while there is an abundance of accommodation on offer, for little ones and their parents who want a family holiday without all the stress there's one place that really stands out: Club Med Bali.




family is entertained and gets a break. What more could you want?



MANTRA ON THE ESPLANADE, DARWIN, NT


For the family who loves the great outdoors, Darwin is a fantastic base from which to explore some of the most exciting and beautiful national parks that Australia has to offer. The world-renowned Kakadu National Park is less than two hours' drive away, and it offers opportunities to go croc spotting, check out Indigenous rock art, hike to waterfalls or go on a boat cruise. Other attractions include the beautiful Katherine Gorge (three hours' drive away) and Litchfield National Park (around 90 minutes' drive from Darwin).

A mini-city break

HILTON MELBOURNE SOUTH WHARF, VIC

Melbourne exudes a certain charm – from its historical buildings to its arts and culture scene. And while that might sound boring for the little ones, the city

also has plenty of activities to keep the kids entertained.

For starters, hop on a tram (around the city circle it's free!). Little sports fans will love the National Sports Museum, housed inside the halls of the MCG, where they can test their sporting prowess with interactive exhibits as well as memorabilia from some of Australia's greatest sporting heroes.

The Hilton South Wharf is a great base from which to explore the city, offering family-friendly two-bedroom suites. The hotel, located on the Yarra River, is just a short walk to many attractions including Sea Life, Melbourne's aquarium. (And for mums, DFO South Wharf is right next door for a quick spot of outlet shopping!)
