On February 8th of this year, Henry Kapono, Malani Bilyeu and Gaylord Holomalia were joined by Johnny Valentine, Alx Kawakami, Blayne Asing and 2017 GRAMMY Award winner Kalani Pe'a for a performance to celebrate the opening of the *We Are Friends: A Lifetime Party of '70s Music* exhibit at the GRAMMY Museum® at L.A. LIVE. The Museum partnered with the Hawaii Academy of Recording Arts – with support from the Hawaii Tourism Authority and presenting sponsor Outrigger Resorts to produce the exhibit, which was on display there until April 2 and has since returned to Honolulu and is on display at the Hawaii Convention Center.

"It was such a great honor to be featured in the GRAMMY Museum®'s exhibit this year, but I am even more humbled to share the stage with these amazing local artists that I admire so much," said Henry Kapono. ABOUT HENRY KAPONO/C&K

Henry Kapono is a performer who has it all – vocalist, guitarist, songwriter, composer, thrilling performer, audience favorite—and multiple honors and awards, including a GRAMMY® nomination. He has taken home numerous Nā Hōkū Hanohano Awards, including Male Vocalist of the Year, Song of the Year, Single of the Year, and Album & Rock Album of the Year.

ABOUT MALANI BILYEU/KALAPANA

In 1973, childhood friends Carl James Malani Bilyeu and David John ("DJ") Pratt auditioned at the Rainbow Villa for Cecilio & Kapono. Malani was soloing at the Oar House in Hawai'i Kai and DJ was downstairs at Chuck's with Kirk Thompson. They got together in DJ's grandfather's garage with Bryant Mackey Feary, another solo act – playing at the Oar House. They wrote songs, rehearsed, and played their first gig at Chuck's in Hawaii Kai. Today, with 18 albums under their belt, a Lifetime Achievement Award in 2011, and decades strong popularity in Hawaii'i, the West Coast, Japan and throughout the Pacific, Kapalana still performs and tours extensively to sold-out venues, with Malani as lead vocalist.

ABOUT JERRY SANTOS/OLOMANA

Best known for his work in the musical group Olomana, Jerry Santos has maintained an influential presence on the Hawai'i music scene for over four decades. Born and raised on the windward side of Oahu and a graduate of The Kamehameha Schools, Jerry established himself early on as one of Hawaii's most prolific songwriters. As a founding member and lead singer of the legendary group, Olomana, Jerry helped to create a unique and easily recognizable musical style, blending Hawaiian music with contemporary rhythms. Over the years, Jerry has performed all over the world and his work has been recognized by the Hawaii musical community with numerous Na Hoku Hanohano Awards. He was also inducted into the Hawaiian Music Hall of Fame in 2011, with the late Robert Beaumont, who co-founded Olomana with Santos.

ABOUT KEOLA BEAMER/THE BEAMER BROTHERS

Keola Beamer is one of Hawaii's premier singer/songwriters, arrangers, composers, and a master of Hawaiian slack-key guitar. "Keola Beamer's [slack-key] style is the best there is on the planet," said Willie Nelson. Beamer comes from a line of musicians five generations back, and can also trace his roots to the House of Kamehameha and Ahiakumai, 15th century rulers of Hawaii. Beamer established himself early as a leader of the wave of contemporary Hawaiian music when he wrote the classic "Honolulu City Lights"- which is still one of the all-time best selling recordings in the history of Hawaiian Music, and he was also the author of the very first Hawaiian Slack-Key Guitar book, published in 1972. Over the years he has received the Hawaii Academy of Recording Arts Lifetime Achievement Award, multiple GRAMMY® nominations and many Na Hoku Hanohano Awards.
